Lt Col Michael E. Trott earned his commission in 2008 from the United States Air Force Academy. He attended Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training in 2009 at Laughlin AFB, Texas, earning his pilot wings in 2010. Lt Col Trott then served as a First Assignment Instructor Pilot in the T-6A. Following this, he was qualified as an F-15E pilot serving at Royal Air Force Lakenheath, United Kingdom and at the F-15E Formal Training Unit at Seymour Johnson AFB, North Carolina.

Lt Col Trott has served in a variety of positions at the squadron, wing, and major command staff levels including Instructor Pilot, Mission Commander, Evaluator Pilot, Flight Commander, Chief of Wing Tactical Integration, Executive Officer, Director of Operations, and Program Branch Chief. Prior to his current position, he was the Director of Operations, 560th Flying Training Squadron, Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph, Texas.

Lt Col Trott is a decorated Command Pilot with more than 3,000 total flying hours, including more than 440 combat hours, in the T-6A, T-38C, and F-15E aircraft. Lt Col Trott has operational and formal training unit experience in the F-15E. He has flown 57 combat missions in support of Operations FREEDOM'S SENTINEL and INHERENT RESOLVE.

SQUADRON HISTORY

The 99 FTS started as the 99th Pursuit Squadron on 19 March 1941 at Chanute Field, IL. It was activated on 22 March 1941 and re-designated as the 99th Fighter Squadron on 15 May 1942. The original "Tuskegee Airmen" squadron, the unit was the first all-black unit in the U.S. Army Air Corps. It was disbanded in 1949 before being re-formed in 1988 flying the T-38 at Williams Air Force Base, Arizona. The squadron moved to Randolph in 1993 and began flying the T-1A aircraft.

Present day, the 99th Flying Training Squadron leads the way on the Air Force's first new trainer aircraft in thirty years, the T-7A Red Hawk.

Lieutenant Colonel Dominique Haig will leave her mark on the Squadron as the latest in a distinguished line of former commanders. Lieutenant Colonel Michael Trott will play a vital role in continuing to mold and shape the future of Air Force pilot training.

Lt Col Dominique M. Haig is the Commander, 99th Flying Training Squadron, Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph, Texas. The 99 FTS is the Department of Defense's T-7A initial operational test and evaluation squadron and will execute T-7A pilot instructor training.

Lt Col Haig earned her commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in 2006 where she was a Distinguished Graduate. Following pilot training, Lt Col Haig remained at Columbus AFB, Mississippi as a First Assignment Instructor Pilot in the T-1A before continuing on to Yokota AB, Japan where she flew the C-130H. While at Yokota AB she held various positions at the squadron and wing level. She was selected for the Air Officer Commanding program at the United States Air Force Academy, Colorado, where she led 115 cadets annually through training in preparation for their commission.
